BEDROOM EMERGENCY KITS



Imagine this...you're asleep and suddenly you hear a tree hitting the side of your house and your bedroom windows break, shattering glass across the floor. Or, an earthquake has happened and your bedroom now has broken glass and a jammed bedroom door. There you are in bed. What do you need immediately to start checking on everyone and everything?

What to put in your kit:

- Plastic or metal box under or near your bed to store the following items
- Hard sole shoes to protect your feet from glass shards you can't see
- Sturdy gloves (leather or sharp resistant) to pick up glass shards

- Glow sticks you snap for instant light and can toss anywhere
- 5 12" crowbar to free that jammed door
- Whistle to attract attention if you become trapped
- Basic First Aid Kit

Consider also keeping nearby:

Flashlight or headlamp with good batteries, Hand crank battery for charging phones and devices, Multi-use tool, Battery powered emergency and weather channel radio, Helmet
